Rhaglen brechu rhag y fflw mewn plant

Rwyf yn ysgrifennu atoch i ddiolch am eich help a'ch cefnogaeth gyda'r rhaglen brechu rhag y fflw mewn plant yn ystod 2015/16 ac i roi'r wybodaeth ddiweddaraf i chi am y cynlluniau ar gyfer yr hydref yma. Y llynedd, derbyniodd 63.4% o blant ysgol oedran cymwys frechiad y fflw yn yr ysgol. Eleni, gyda'ch cefnogaeth chi, rydym yn gobeithio adeiladu ar y llwyddiant hwnnw.

Yn 2016/17, yn ogystal â'r plant yn y **dosbarth derbyn, blwyddyn 1 a blwyddyn 2**, bydd plant ym **mlwyddyn 3** yn cael cynnig brechiad y fflw ar ffurf chwistrell trwyn yn yr ysgol hefyd.

Bydd trefniadau'n cael eu gwneud yn lleol ynghylch y sesiwn brechiad y fflw yn eich ysgol. Efallai bod rhywun wedi cysylltu â chi eisoes ac, os nad oes, mae'n bur debyg y bydd eich bwrdd iechyd lleol yn cysylltu cyn diwedd y tymor ysgol.

Mae disgwyl i gynnig brechiad y fflw i bob plentyn yn y dosbarth derbyn, blwyddyn 1, blwyddyn 2 a blwyddyn 3 leihau salwch y fflw mewn plant, ymhlith staff ysgolion ac yn y gymuned, gan roi hwb i ffigurau presenoldeb ysgolion dros fisoedd y gaeaf.

Dylai'r plant ym mlynnyddoedd 4, 5 a 6 sydd â chyflwr iechyd sy'n eu rhoi mewn perygl o gymhlethdodau'r fflw barhau i gael eu brechu gan eu meddyg teulu.


Hefyd, mae plant dwy a thair oed (ar 31^{ain} Awst 2016) yn gymwys am frechiad y fflw a byddant yn cael cynnig eu brechiad yn y feddygfa.

Dear Headteacher,

Childhood influenza vaccination programme

I'm writing to thank you for your help and support with the childhood influenza (flu) vaccination programme in 2015/16 and update you regarding the plans for this autumn. Last year 63.4% of eligible school age children received a flu vaccine in school. This year, with your support, we hope to build on that success.

In 2016/17, as well as children in **reception class, year 1 and year 2**, children in **year 3** will also be offered a nasal spray flu vaccine in school.

Arrangements will be made locally regarding the flu vaccination session in your school. You may have been contacted already, but, if not it is likely that you will be contacted by your local health board before the end of the school term.

Offering flu vaccine to all children in reception class, year 1, year 2 and year 3 is expected to reduce flu illness in children, school staff and the community, and to boost school attendance during the winter months.

Children in school years 4, 5 and 6 who have a health condition that puts them at risk from the complications of flu should continue to be vaccinated by their own GP.

Children aged two and three years old (age on 31st August 2016) are also eligible for a flu vaccine and they will be offered their vaccine at their GP surgery.

We would also like to take this opportunity to ask for your help in highlighting to new parents the importance of being up to date with all immunisations before their child starts school. Around 1 in 8 four year olds are not fully immunised and are vulnerable to catching and spreading serious diseases such as whooping cough and measles.

The success of the childhood flu programme depends on the support of schools. We apologise in advance for any disruption that may occur and thank you for your support.
